
WHAT CHANGES IS CDS BRINGING?



It's basically a change in IT system for making UK customs declarations: From CHIEF to CDS



We'll also need to enter additional data:
Including Incoterms and place



HOW ARE WE PREPARING?



We have upgraded our systems and are running CHIEF and CDS concurrently



We've been using CDS for shipments between the UK and Northern Ireland, and NI and the rest of the world, for more than 18 months



Our teams across the UK are fully trained on CDS and ready for the switchover on 1 October!
